

Short Synopsis

A tradition of violence that goes back generations is threatened when one father hesitates to indoctrinate his son into the insanity.

Long Synopsis

In The Tradition of My Family is a gothic family saga. This seemingly normal, middle-class family has a unique tradition. When a son reaches his thirteenth birthday, his father wounds him with a gun, honoring both the long-standing family tradition and the boy, who is now a "new man."

The more dangerous the shooting and the more ghastly the scar, the more the recipient is honored by the family. That is, if he actually survives his wound. The film follows a young boy named Billy as he prepares for and experiences his new man ritual.

In The Tradition of My Family examines what happens when these concepts of tradition and honor are questioned and the subsequent effect on the father's relationship with his son.



ABOUT THE PRODUCTION

In The Tradition of My Family was directed by and adapted for the screen by Todd Davis, and was shot on Super 16mm film by cinematographer Austin de Besche (Return of the Secaucus 7, Lianna). Emmy award-winner ("Desperate Housewives") and two-time ACE Eddie award-winner ("Sex and the City") Michael Berenbaum edited the film. Michael is a member of the American Cinema Editors Society.

In The Tradition of My Family is based on the short story by Phil LaMarche. "In the Tradition of My Family" was published in the Spring/Summer 2005 edition of Ninth Letter (www.ninthletter.com), a literary journal produced by the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. Phil's first novel, "American Youth," was published by Random House in April of 2007, and has been nominated for a Quill Award for General Fiction.

Many other experienced professionals were on-set, including: Phil Darrell (gaffer), Geoffrey Rockwell (key grip), Mario Cardenas, G. John Garrett, and Stewart Adam (sound mixers), Jenny McCracken (production design), Jamie Companeschi (1st assistant director), Jeremy Oneail (makeup effects), and Rosa J. Colón (costume designer). David Grimes composed the music.

The cast includes experienced Boston-area Screen Actors Guild members Rachel Harker (The Mother), Jim Loutzenhiser (Benjamin), Kippy Goldfarb (Aunt Elize), Mick Hoegen (Uncle Aldus), Joanna Herrington (Aunt Tina), Chris Conte (Uncle Jess), and Chuck Brinig (The Grandfather). In The Tradition of My Family introduces Paul Kmiec in the role of Billy and Jason Ferriter as Billy at 21.

The film was shot in Boxborough, Massachusetts, about 30 miles west of Boston, June 3 through June 8, 2005.





ABOUT THE FILMMAKERS

TODD DAVIS - DIRECTOR

Todd Davis has extensive directing, editing and producing experience with short film projects, contributing to numerous festival-selected and award-winning short films. He was named runner-up for the Most Promising New England Filmmaker award at the 2006 Boston Underground Film Festival, and has taught graduate-level digital editing at Boston University. *In The Tradition of My Family* was produced by orLater Productions LLC, Mr. Davis's production company. Davis holds an MFA in Film Production from Boston University, where he was a teaching assistant in master's level courses on directing theatrical and television films. He was 1st Assistant Director on "Roller Palace," a sitcom pilot produced by mtvU, MSN, and Boston University. In addition, Davis has edited over 60 short narratives and documentaries. Mr. Davis also holds a BS from the University of Pennsylvania and an MS from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst.



PHIL LaMARCHE - AUTHOR

In The Tradition of My Family is based on the short story by Phil LaMarche, a former writing fellow in the Syracuse University Creative Writing Program. "In the Tradition of My Family" was published in the Spring/Summer 2005 edition of Ninth Letter (www.ninthletter.com), a literary journal from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, and was selected as a finalist for the Robert Olen Butler prize from the Del Sol Press. LaMarche was the Ivan Klima Fiction Fellow in Prague and completed the Summer Literary Seminar in St. Petersburg, Russia. His first novel, "American Youth," was published by Random House in April of 2007, and has been nominated for a Quill Award for General Fiction.




ABOUT THE FILMMAKERS

AUSTIN de BESCHE - DIRECTOR OF PHOTOGRAPHY

Austin de Besche has been a cinematographer for over thirty-four years and a director for half that time. His cinematography credits include: the feature films *Return of the Secaucus 7* and *Lianna* (both directed

by John Sayles); On Thin Ice, an Emmy-winning anti-drug documentary; I'm a Stranger Here Myself, a feature-length documentary about Nicholas Ray (director of Rebel Without a Cause, etc.); second-unit television work for Cheers and St. Elsewhere; and corporate films and commercials numbered in the thousands. He co-photographed Voices of the Children, a documentary on Holocaust survivors, which won a National Emmy in 1999. Return of the Secaucus 7 was chosen for the "10 Best Films of 1980" list of the Los Angeles Times and Time Magazine. As a director, de Besche works in many styles and formats—from cinema-verité documentary to large studio



production, miniDV video to 35mm film. He has served as director/cameraman on numerous promotions for The Discovery Channel, A&E Networks, The History Channel, and many other television and cable networks. Another noteworthy project is *A Taste of Chanukah*, a concert special directed and co-written by de Besche, starring Theodore Bikel.

de Besche served for three seasons as the primary director of photography and as a segment producer/writer/director on *The Wild Web*, a nationally syndicated weekly television magazine show about the internet, distributed by CBS/Eyemark. He was also the senior director of photography on the national PBS children's show "Postcards from Buster." de Besche's *Pilgrimage into the Past*, a documentary he produced, directed and photographed, tells the story of a Holocaust survivor who was, with thousands of others, part of a forced "death march" just before the end of the Second World War. It premiered at the 2002 Boston Jewish Film Festival and won a Gold Remi Award at WorldFest Houston 2003, where he also won a Silver Remi Award for Cinematography for *In The Tradition of My Family* in 2006.



ABOUT THE FILMMAKERS

MICHAEL BERENBAUM, A.C.E. - EDITOR

Michael Berenbaum has over twenty years of editing experience for both feature films and television. He is a member of the American Cinema Editors Society (ACE), and received an Emmy award for the pilot episode of *Desperate Housewives*. Berenbaum has collaborated with an array of directors including Joel and Ethan Coen, John Turturro, Al Pacino, Julian Schnabel, and Martin Scorsese. He edited the HBO series *Sex and the City* and won two ACE Eddie Awards for his work on that show. His recent projects include *Hollywoodland*, starring Ben Affleck, Adrian Brody, and Diane Lane and *War, Inc.*, with John Cusack, Marisa Tomei and Ben Kingsley. Michael will next edit the feature film version of *Sex and the City*.





JENNY McCRACKEN - PRODUCTION DESIGNER

Having recently completed her role as Art Director for the independent film *The Winter People*, Jenny McCracken signed on as Production Designer for *In The Tradition of My Family*. McCracken has also been a member of the Art Department for the feature films *The Blue Diner*, *State and Main*, *Outside Providence* and *The Crucible*. Her debut directorial effort *Water From The Moon* was featured in the shorts program at the Slamdance Film Festival.

ROSA J. COLÓN - COSTUMER DESIGNER

Rosa J. Colón has worked as costume designer and assistant wardrobe on several short and feature films in the Boston area including *Turntable* and *Crippled Creek*. She received her degree from Emerson College and would eventually like to continue her work in New York and Los Angeles.





JEREMY ONEAIL - MAKEUP EFFECTS

Jeremy Oneail resides in the Boston area and has been doing makeup and special effects since 2000. His expertise made for spectacular gun shot wound and scar effects for the film. Additionally, Jeremy has worked the films *Detour Into Madness* and *Disappearances*, and many local theatrical projects. In his spare time, Oneail practices and teaches historical European medieval martial arts.




